215w-11 Raglan Knit



Suggested yarn:

- Pierrot Yarns Fine Merino [100% merino wool; 103 yds/94m per 1.06 oz./30g skein];
 - small: color #214 crimson, 4 skeins [105g]
 - large: color #214 crimson, 8 skeins [240g]
- Pierrot Yarns Nordic Super Bulky [100% Wool; 58yds/53m per 2.82oz/80g skein];
 - small: color #55 wine red, 2 skeins [135g]
 - large: color #55 wine red, 4 skeins [320g]

Tools/Notions:

• 3.3mm (approx. US 4), 3.9mm (approx. US 6), and 15mm (US 19) knitting needles or sizes necessary to achieve gauge

large:

• 3.3mm (approx. US 4) double-pointed knitting needles or size necessary to achieve gauge

Finished measurements:

- small:
 - chest 78cm/30.71"
 - center back neck-to-cuff 57.5cm/22.64"
 - back length 36cm/14.17"

Gauge (10cm/4" square):

- stockinette stitch (with 15mm needles): 7 sts and 10 rows
- stockinette stitch (with 3.9mm needles): 21 sts and 28 rows

Gauge may vary according to individual knitting style. Change needle size if necessary to achieve gauge. Alternatively, rework pattern with your own gauge measurements.

center back neck-to-cuff 74cm/29.13"

chest 89cm/35.04"

back length 62cm/24.41"

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Summary

Body: Cast on with crochet provisional cast-on method, then work in stockinette stitch. Shape raglan edges and neckline, respectively, by binding off stitches as indicated and by working fully fashioned decreases 1 stitch in from edge.

Sleeve (make 2): Cast on with long-tail cast-on method, then work in k1p1 ribbing. Continue in stockinette stitch. Shape raglan edges by working fully fashioned decreases 2 stitches in from edge.

Finishing: Remove provisional cast-on edge at hem, picking up live stitches as you go. Work edging in k1p1 ribbing, then bind off in pattern. Seam raglan edges with mattress stitch, but use Kitchener stitch to graft underarm gusset. Seam sides and sleeve undersides with one continuous mattress stitch seam per side. Pick up stitches around neckline; work collar edging in k1p1 ribbing in the round, then bind off in pattern.

Abbreviations:

BO = bind off CO = cast on PU = pick up RE = row(s) even #-#-# = rows-stitches-times

= large size

*Where only one set of numbers is given, it refers to both sizes.
