

# 824mfhw Handwarmer



## Suggested yarn:

- Baruffa Cashmere [100% cashmere; 118 yds/108m per 0.88 oz./25g skein]; color #001 natural, 3 skeins [70g]

## Tools/Notions:

- 3.3mm (approx. US 4) and 3.9mm (approx. US 6) knitting needles or sizes necessary to achieve gauge
- cable needle
- sewing needle

## Finished measurements:

- arm circumference 19cm/7.48"
- length 19cm/7.48"

## Gauge (10cm/4" square):

- pattern stitch A w/ 3.9mm (approx. US 6): 25.5 sts and 30 rows
- stockinette stitch: 23 sts and 32 rows
- pattern stitch B: 27.5 sts and 32 rows

Gauge may vary according to individual knitting style. Change needle size if necessary to achieve gauge. Alternatively, rework pattern with your own gauge measurements.

## Summary


Cast on for left hand with long-tail cast-on method. Work 4 rows of (American) moss stitch, then continue in pattern stitch A. Referring to chart, work back of hand in pattern stitch B and palm of hand in stockinette stitch. Work stitches around thumb opening with waste yarn. Continue in k1p1 ribbing for 4 rows, then bind off in pattern. Pick up stitches from waste yarn for thumb (removing waste yarn in the process); work 10 rounds of stockinette stitch, then 4 rounds of k1p1 ribbing, then bind off in pattern. With wrong sides facing each other, seam sides together with mattress stitch. Reverse shaping for right hand.

## Abbreviations:

BO = bind off  
CO = cast on  
k = knit  
p = purl  
PU = pick up stitch(es)  
st st = stockinette stitch


※Reverse shaping for right hand.




