

tricot10-3 Loop Shawl



Suggested yarn:

- Keito-Zakka Stores Grandir [80% wool, 20% alpaca; 79 yds/72m per 1.41 oz./40g skein];
 - color #11 snow, 5 skeins [180g]
- Pierrot Yarns Macon [70% alpaca, 30% nylon; 80 yds/73m per 0.88 oz./25g skein];
 - color #26 gray, 4 skeins [135g]

Tools/Notions:

- 6.6mm (approx. US 10.5) and 7.0mm (no US equivalent) knitting needles or sizes necessary to achieve gauge

Finished measurements:

- width 26cm/10.24"
- length 171cm/67.32"

Gauge (10cm/4" square):

- k2p2 ribbing: 17 sts and 15 rows

Gauge may vary according to individual knitting style. Change needle size if necessary to achieve gauge. Alternatively, rework pattern with your own gauge measurements.

Summary

❖**Note:** entire shawl worked with 2 strands of yarn worked together (1 strand of Grandir, 1 strand of Macon).

Shawl: Cast on 4 sts with long-tail cast-on method. Work in k2p2 ribbing, increasing every 2 rows with backwards loop cast-on increase until you have 44 sts. Continue in k1p1 ribbing and then resume working in k2p2 ribbing. Shape this end of shawl using short rows as shown in chart. After all short rows are finished, work 1 further row in k2p2 ribbing across all stitches on needles. Bind off a little bit tightly.

Finishing: Knit loop in garter stitch and seam to garment.

Abbreviations:

BO = bind off

CO = cast on

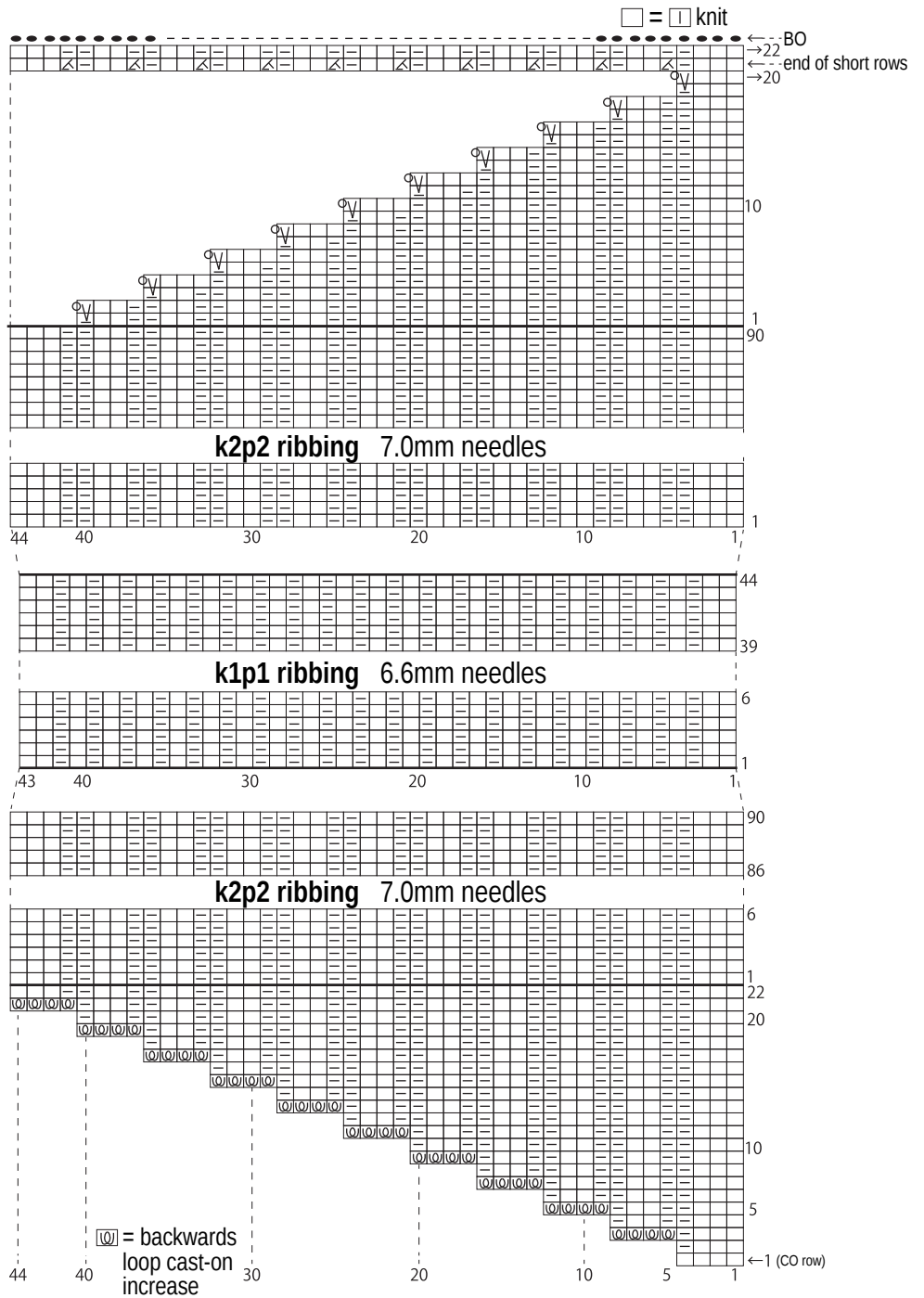
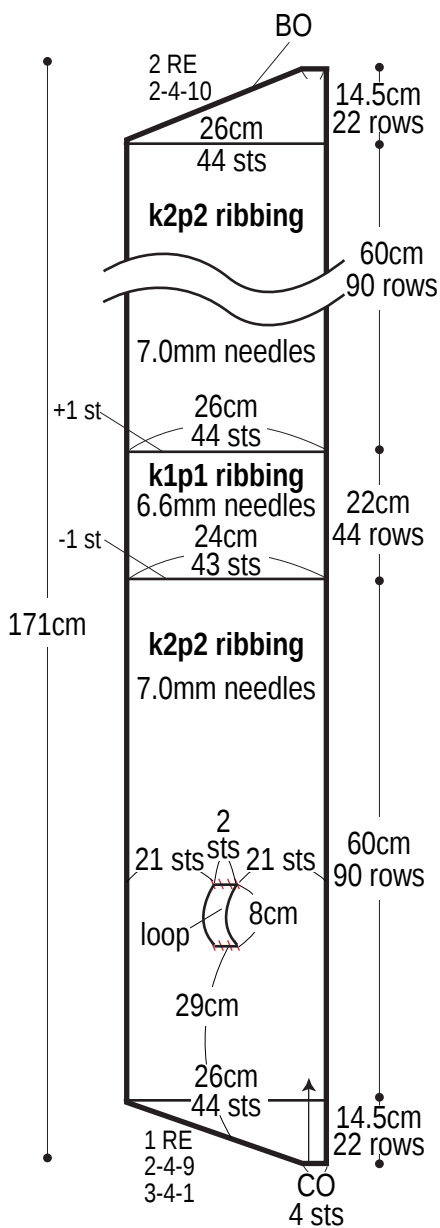
k = knit

p = purl

RE = row(s) even

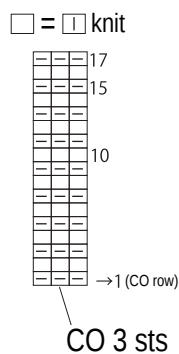
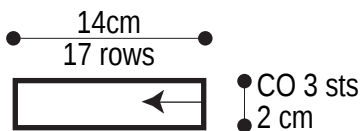
#-#-# = rows-stitches-times
