

# 214w-11 Switch Socks



## Suggested yarn:

- Pierrot Yarns Friends [65% wool, 35% acrylic; 186 yds/170m per 1.41 oz./40g skein]; color #10 bitter brown, 1 skein [20g]
- Pierrot Yarns Nimes [70% baby alpaca, 40% nylon; 142 yds/130m per 0.88 oz./25g skein]; color #03 cinnamon, 1 skein [5g]

## Tools/Notions:

- 2.7mm (approx. US 2) double-pointed knitting needles or size necessary to achieve gauge

## Finished measurements:

- foot length 18.5cm/7.28"
- ankle circumference 17cm/6.69"
- cuff length (from heel to top of cuff) 9cm/3.54"

## Gauge (10cm/4" square):

- stockinette stitch: 29.5 sts and 40 rows

*Gauge may vary according to individual knitting style. Change needle size if necessary to achieve gauge. Alternatively, rework pattern with your own gauge measurements.*

## Summary

Cast on with long-tail cast-on method and join into the round to begin working from the ankle downward. Work 14 rounds of k1p1 ribbing with Nimes. Change yarn to Friends, then work 8 rounds of stockinette stitch, working increases in first round of stockinette stitch only. Continue to instep, heel, and tip of toe, working in stockinette stitch according to schematic. Seam toe with Kitchener stitch.

## Abbreviations:

CO = cast on

k = knit

k2tog = knit 2 stitches together

OH = on hold (that is, place on stitch holder)

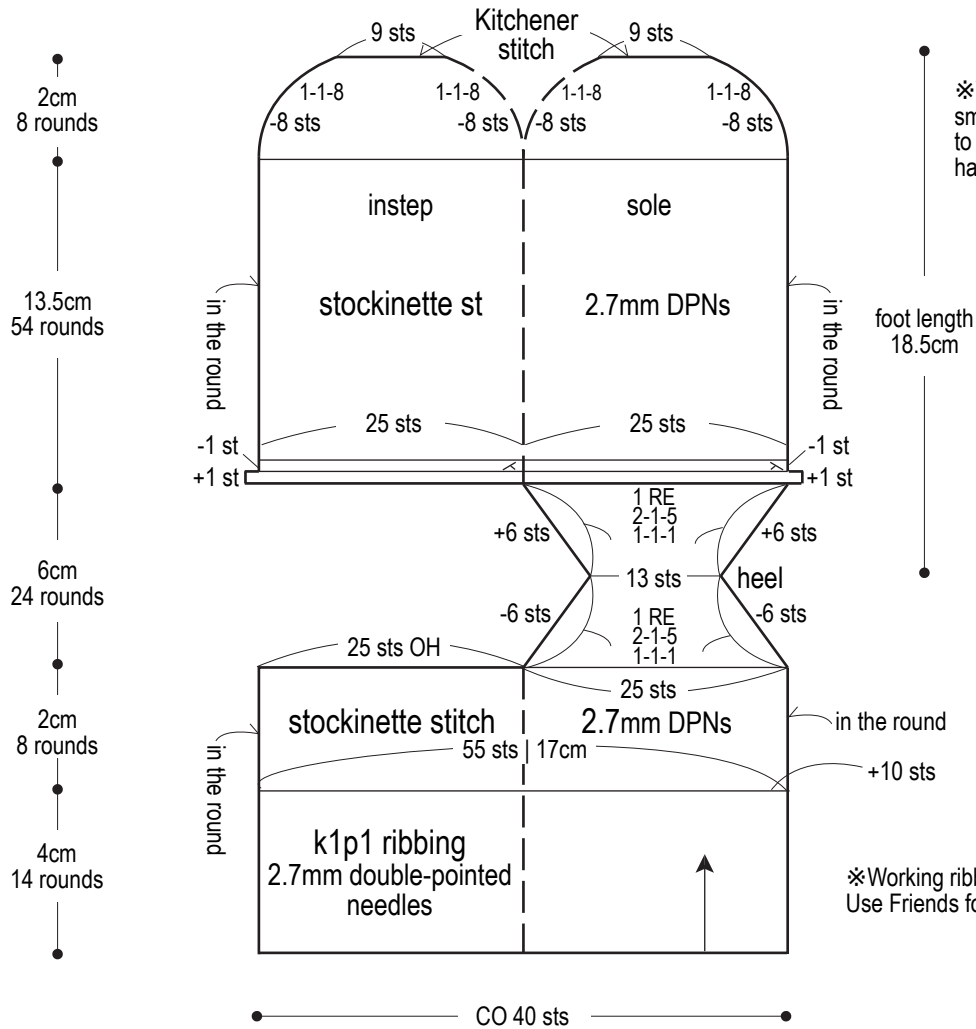
p = purl

RE = row(s)/round(s) even

ssk = slip, slip, knit = slip 1 st knitwise, slip 1 st knitwise, k the two slipped sts together

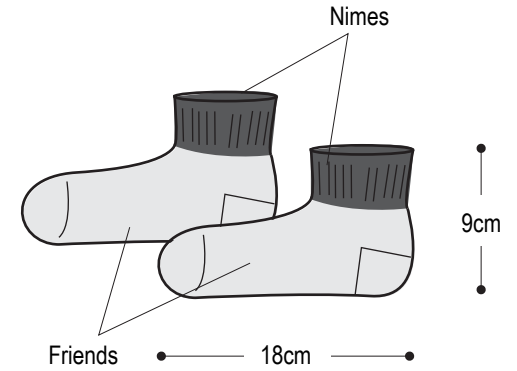
### = rows-stitches-times

※The foot is designed somewhat smaller than the stated foot length to account for stretching. (That is, it has negative ease.)

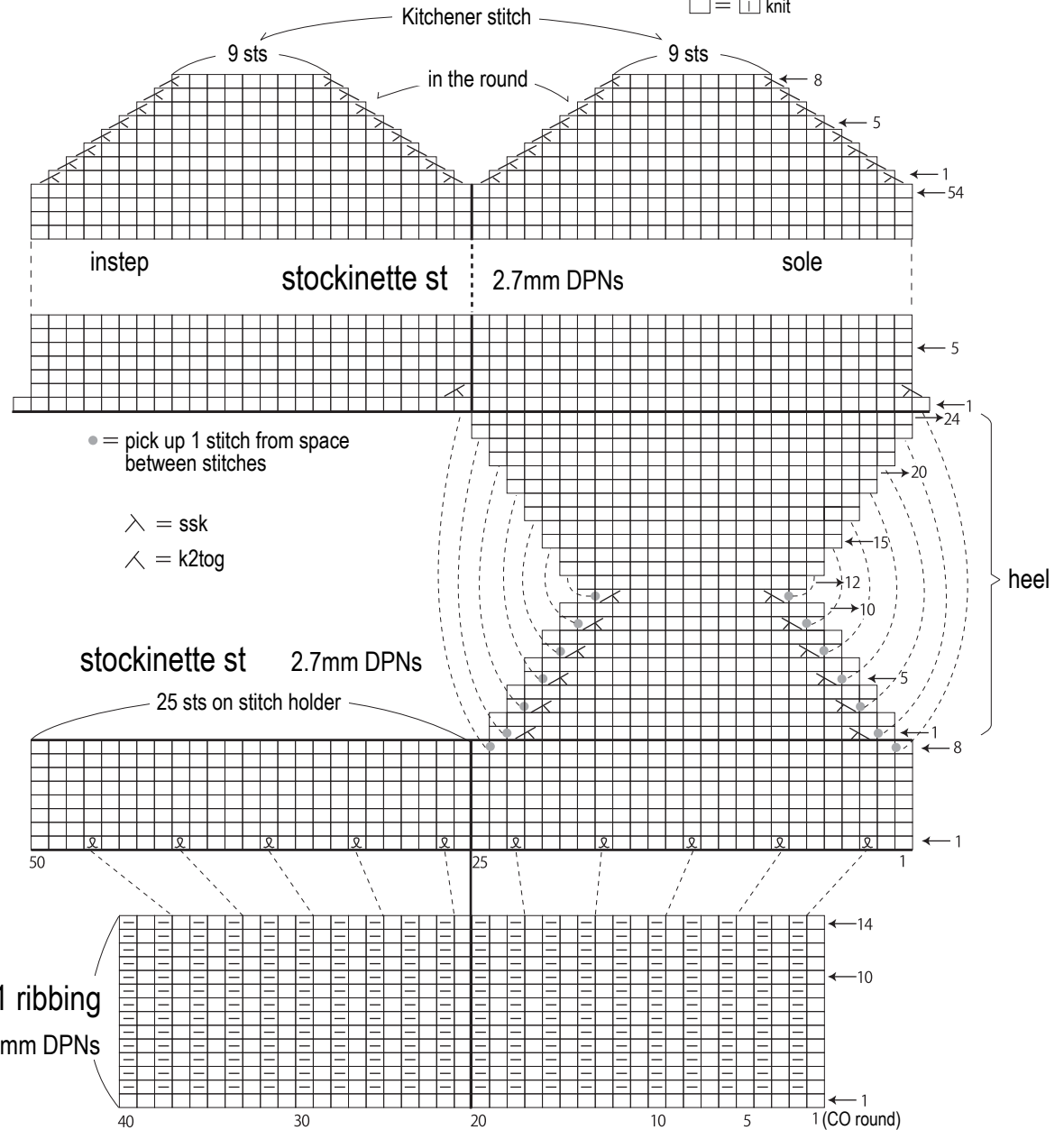

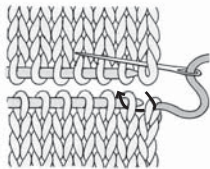
# Sock instructions

□ = □ knit

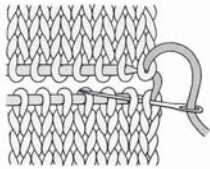


## Kitchener stitch instructions

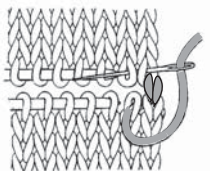
① Insert needle into 1 st at edge.



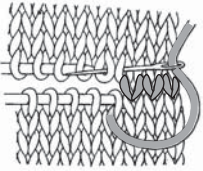
② Insert needle where marked in step ①.



③ Insert needle through edge st and st next to it.



④ Repeat steps ② and ③.



\*Align stitches of knitted fabric. Graft together by linking each stitch to the ones below it, forming a row of knit stitches as you go.
